During Sunday's GS race, Mike Altenburg had a very fast first run down a very fast course on FIS at Boyne, in fact it was almost two seconds faster than the next fastest racer in his class. In his second run, he was well on his way to another fast run when he realized that he was rapidly gaining on the racer in front of him who had a glitch and lost a lot of his speed. He felt that as long as he finished behind him the timer would get both of their times. As it worked out, he was so close to the racer in front of him (mere inches) that the timing equipment could not tell the difference between their times and he had to take a re-run. On the re-run he fell and got a DNF for the run which took him from a sure first place to no place. What made this even worse, the zero points for a DNF versus the 25 points for winning the race left him in third place for the season versus having a commanding lead going into the final race weekend. This is a bummer!!!

My nephew, Zach Jablonski, loves the tight gates of slalom courses and does not enjoy the few and wide gates of GS and super GS race courses. Not that he skis slowly in the wide open courses, just slowly relative to his competitors. In slalom, he beats the nearest competition by up to eight seconds in a race, which is quite significant. In fact, he enjoys slalom so much, that he has chosen to skip the speed races this season. I guess you can't argue with doing what you really enjoy and doing it very well.

On the other end of the age and ability spectrum, is me. If you recall, at this time last season, my season ended with my first trip down the ski hill in a ski patrol sled (after 56 years of skiing) with a badly dislocated shoulder. Over the summer, the more I thought about it, I realized that my skiing/racing injuries have all taken place racing slalom courses. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to realize that eliminating slalom from my race activities will lengthen my skiing career and make it more fun. So, that is what I have done. I am now a speed specialist and enjoying it more. I am getting slower in my old age, but still having fun skiing fast.

## A Ski Racing Refresher Course:

The MACC (Michigan Alpine Competition Council) ski race program is structured as follows:

- The racing is both individual and teams, with most teams being clubs that are members of the MDSC (Metropolitan Detroit Ski Council).
- The classes are set up by ability levels, with Open Elite (O) being the fastest racers, followed by E1, E2, A, B, C, and D
- Classes are divided by sex, with M for men and W for women.
- If there are enough racers, classes are further divided by age, 60 and over are Super Veterans (SV), 40 through 59 are Veterans (V), and 39 and younger have no age designations.

### First Race Weekend: January 21-22:

The first race weekend of the 2023 MACC season took place on January 21-22, as the originally scheduled first weekend of January 7-8 was cancelled due to the lack of sufficient snow, which is the same thing that happened in 2021 and 2022. The races took place in barely freezing (30-32F) weather conditions with marginally acceptable snow conditions on both Saturday and Sunday. Both GS and slalom were raced on North Boyne, as neither FIS or Superbowl had sufficient snow cover.

For the T-Bird Race Team, this weekend was somewhat successful, with 9 T-Bird Racers going through the courses on Saturday and Sunday. The T-Bird's that made the podium (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup>) are as follows:

### Mike's Musings:

We are not sure of the reason, but something has continued to take its toll on the number of racers registered, both in the overall MACC program and in the number of T-Birds registered. We are all hoping that this problem (virus or whatever) goes away, so that everyone can and will return to ski racing in the future.

There is some good news for this season for the Race Team. **Will Heckman** (E2M) has returned to racing after a few seasons off. His full form hasn't returned yet, but he's not far out of contention. A number of the T-Birds are continuing to improve their racing performance, including **Steven Foradori** (VBM) and **Scott Soucie** (AM). The team prospects are looking good.

My new motto is "fast is fun". Hopefully, I can still go fast enough to be competitive. I'm too young to retire from racing.
